

2025 Progress Highlights

- 1 Set up the ASFF, with a constitution, bank account, stripe account, a web site, and an active membership who 'contribute' to the debates and to the actions.
- 2 Built good partnerships with key players, particularly the National Flood Forum, the Town Council, the Village Society, the National Trust and Shropshire Council.
- 3 Jointly with the Town Council, commissioned consultants to undertake a flood study of the Long Mynd.
- 4 Completed a comprehensive report into the Natural Flood Management opportunities at Open Coppice field.
- 5 Cleared vegetation from the Batch Valley stream.
- 6 Secured planning consent and felled two trees in the Batch Valley Stream.
- 7 Installed a water monitor in the Batch Valley stream (See photographs)
Thanks go to Tim Goodwin for his time and technical expertise in designing/commissioning the monitor and the All Stretton Village Society for funding it. Data gathering has already commenced, and work is in progress to collate this data with local weather data.
- 8 Lobbied Shropshire Council to clear the culvert under the B5477.
9. Secured nearly £3000 to fund all of the activities above.
